PART OF FLOWERS SCIENCE ACTIVITY FOR GRADE 6







The **starch test** is used to detect the presence of starch in substances. It involves adding iodine solution to a sample. If starch is present, the iodine will change colour to blue-black. This simple test is commonly used in educational settings to teach students about carbohydrates and chemical reactions, demonstrating how indicators work in identifying specific compounds.

PARTS OF THE FLOWERS WERE EXPLAINED TO THE STUDENTS

Flowers are essential for plant reproduction and have several important parts. The **petals** attract pollinators with their color and scent. The **sepals** protect the flower bud. The **stamens**, which include the anther and filament, are the male reproductive parts that produce pollen. The **pistil** is the female part, consisting of the stigma, style, and ovary. SPECIAL DAY CELEBREATIONS




